Weight Limit for Willoughby following pressure from your Parish Council.

Warwickshire County Council Traffic and Road Safety are looking at a Proposed Traffic Regulation Order 7.5 Tonne Weight Limit for Willoughby and Grandborough.

As part of this year's programme of works agreed at the delegated budgets transport seminar, it has been approved to fund a Traffic Regulation Order for the 7.5 tonne weight limit at Willoughby and Grandborough.

Access for HGV's for delivery and loading will be permitted as part of this scheme.

As part of this work they will be looking at the movement of HGV's along Longdown Lane.

It is anticipated that following a successful consultation, that the works can be included in the current programme of works with completion of the scheme during 2015/2016.

Police & Neighbourhood Watch

Lot's of warnings about scams over the last month. Including one purporting to be telephone call from the Home Office!! The scenarios are many and varied but if you haven't asked for contact then it's at best a cold call or worst fraudulent. Don't give any personal information or bank details until you are certain the approach is genuine.

Also very realistic web sites selling top of the range TVs cheap - payment is requested by Bank transfer. You have no recourse when the TV doesn't get delivered!!

Crime reports, fraud alerts etc.: Reports of local crimes, suspicious activity etc. are received by Neighbourhood Watch from various sources. These are sent to villagers by e-mail and can be viewed on the noticeboard near the Village Hall. To receive them by e-mail contact the Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator (see below).

Crime prevention: Smart water, a means of uniquely marking your property can be obtained via Rachel Settle. It is a deterrent to burglars and increases the likelihood of stolen items being returned.
