Natural England have extended the 'Stop Notice', preventing further ploughing, until mid-February. They will then consider whether to issue a remediation notice in the light of the Planning Committee's decision (now expected to be at their meeting at the beginning of February).

The Environment Agency have added an objection to the intention to use a septic tank on the site. This means that a connection would have to be made to the main sewers, if the plans were approved.

A flyer will be issued when the Planning Committee meeting details are known. As many of us as possible should attend the meeting. Although members of the public cannot speak at the meeting their presence concentrates minds!!

Willoughby 2012

As the December edition went to print we heard that The Central Warwickshire Villages Leader Programme had approved our application for funding to enable us to hold a series of events to celebrate the Queens Jubilee, London 2012, and the Willoughby Society's 50th anniversary, on a scale and variety we couldn't normally hope to do.

The funding will enable us to have a Marquee, with room for nearly everyone to sit down for a meal and have space for a dance floor, on the playing field behind the Village Hall for the Jubilee Bank Holiday weekend (2nd-5th June). A Grand opening event will be held on the 2nd and we shall have a 'Big Jubilee Lunch' on the following Monday.

After the weekend the Marquee will be swapped for a Blue and White Striped Big Top with a stage area. This will be used as an auditorium able to seat 200!! for performances and as a covered space for other activities. The next weekend will have an 'Arts' theme with opportunities to see and try various arts and crafts, listen to different types of music, and much more.

Friday 15th sees us turning the clock back before Ipads, PCs, Radios, newspapers, and even before books, a master Story Teller will be in the Big Top recounting a tale worthy of the most advanced computer game. A percussionist will add to the atmosphere which promises to be spine tingling!! The Heritage theme will continue the following day with displays of local history, traditional country crafts, old machinery, and in respect to our village's Anglo-Saxon/Viking past a visit from a raiding party. In the evening we are planning to have folk music and dance in the Big Top.

This is just a flavour of what is being planned – there will be much more!! The objective is to provide something for everyone and give everyone the opportunity to be involved. The Jubilee weekend events are for villagers and the others for villagers, friends & family, and residents of our neighbouring villages. The Village Fête and Football challenge will take place the following weekend as usual.
