The cricket season is well under way at Willoughby Cricket Club with plenty going on each week across the Mens, Youth Teams of Under 13 & Under 15s, and Ladies Tip & Run teams

The club's Saturday Morning coaching and game sessions have kicked off, and they would love as many boys and girls from the village as possible to come along and get involved. The sessions run every Saturday morning, from 10.30 to 12.00 midday, and are available for all boys and girls aged 7 to 16.

Cost is only £1.00 per session. All equipment is provided - but you can bring your own if you have it; the club also has equipment to play Kwik Cricket, and will be having special Kwik Cricket nights in June, July and August for ages 7 to 12 years.

- Vintage Cars and Motorcycles.



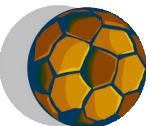
There will also be a variety of fun side stalls including, splat the rat, balls in a bucket, bean bags, tin can shy, putting, skittles and shove halfpenny.

Dog Owners

Dog fouling problems have been reported again, this time on a drive in Lower Street and adjacent to the field path off Moor Lane. Remember it is your responsibility to clear up after your dog not the land owners. As well as being most unpleasant, failure to clear up is a serious health hazard especially for children. The Dog Control Order was implemented in 2009 that introduced a fixed penalty notice of £80 (£50 for early payment) or if taken to court the maximum fine is £1,000. The Parish Council has indicated that offenders will be reported to the dog warden.
